## **APPLICATION PROCESS**

### 1. Nomination

Our exchange partners may nominate their students by email until given deadline. The nomination details need to include students full name, email address, period of study, academic major and intended field of study.

## 2. Application \* Deadline: October 30, 2021

After being nominated, our exchange partner will receive an email with attachments. The program coordinator should submit the following documents:

- · Application form
- · Study Plan
- Copy of Passport
- Scanned Copy of Photo
- · Certificate of Enrollment (Eng)
- Transcript (Eng)

#### Eligibility

Students nominees are required to meet the following criteria:

- enrolled as a full-time student at one of our exchange partner universities
- completed at least 1 semester at their home university
- be in a good academic standing (
   \infty No minimum GPA requirements)

## 3. Acceptance

The application screening process will be conducted at once after we receive all applications. Students can expect to receive a decision on their application within one month from application deadline. After being accepted, students will receive an acceptance package including official acceptance letter and certificate of admission for visa purposes

## 4. Visa

Students will need to visit the Korean embassy or consulate in their home country to obtain a student Visa(D-2-6). Visa fees may apply

## 5. Health Insurance

Students will need to purchase a health insurance in their home country or Korea submit the certificate to the office. (Mandatory) The insurance policy should cover sickness, accident and death.

#### Sunchon Tour for Chuseok



Chuseok is the biggest national holiday that celebrates the full moon of the eighth month in the lunar calendar. Every year during the Chuseok, the university offers international students snacks and conducts safety instructions to them. - · A bottle of Water: 1000 won
- Starbucks tall size Americano: 4100 won
- · McDonald's Big Mac set: 6400 won
- Bread or buns in a bakery: 2000-5000 won
- Movie at theater: 9000 won(varies depending on time/date)
